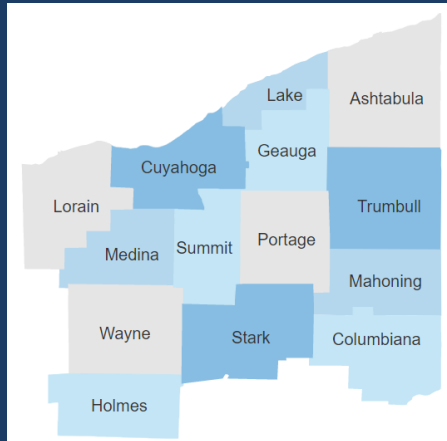

As a youth serving professional, you may be wondering how to support your youths' developmental needs and understanding of COVID-19. Honest and accurate discussion with youth about COVID-19 can help them understand what's happening, relieve some of their fears, make them feel safe and help them begin to cope.

Ohio PREP uses a train the trainer model to prepare direct care staff to implement MPC with youth in their care. The goal of the training is to provide direct care staff with the skills needed to present information clearly, respond to participant questions, and lead activities that reinforce learning.

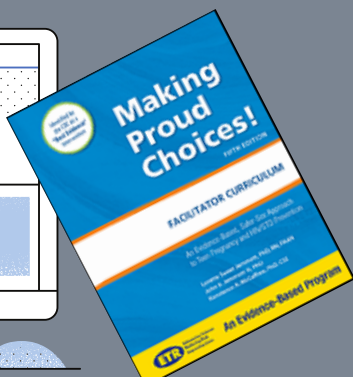
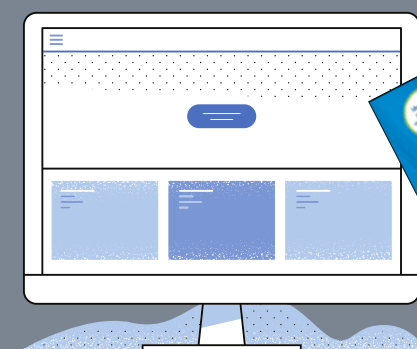
