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

Stark County THRIVE Announces an Improvement in Infant Vitality

CANTON, OHIO – Canton City Public Health on behalf of Stark County THRIVE announced today that Infant Vitality in Stark County has improved!

In 2017, Stark County's infant mortality rate (IMR) was 9.5, which was an increase from the 2016 rate of 9.0. Preliminary 2018 data shows a promising decrease in overall infant mortality in Stark County with a rate of 6.4 and a Black to White disparity rate ratio of nearly one. This means in 2018, Black and White babies experienced near equity in the rates of vitality after birth. (Infant mortality is defined as the death of a live-born baby before their first birthday and infant mortality rates are calculated per 1,000 live births.)
