Canton City Public Health Announces Health and Back-to-School Fair August 14th

(Canton, OH) – Canton City Public Health (CCPH) is pleased to announce a Health and Back-to-School Fair on Saturday, August 14th at Crenshaw Park from 12 p.m. to 5 p.m. This event is free and open to all members of the community.

Canton City Public Health has partnered with several Southeast Canton churches, Buckeye Health Plan, and the Greater Stark County Urban League to organize the fair which will feature free health screenings; vision screenings; COVID vaccinations; family activities including games and raffles; free food; haircuts; and a backpack and school supplies giveaway. Medicaid and MyCare members of managed care plans, age 18 and older with a valid ID, who get vaccinated at the event will receive a \$100 gift card. CCPH will provide a \$100 Walmart gift card to those who receive a vaccine and are not on managed care plan.

"The health and back-to-school fair will be a day of fun for the community that offers free health services including COVID-19 vaccines," said Jim Adams, Health Commissioner for Canton City Public Health. "Vaccination remains essential to the health of our community, and I hope everyone who has not yet been vaccinated for COVID will visit us and receive a vaccine to help protect loved ones."

"Supporting healthy habits is a priority for our church, and I look forward to the community coming together for a day of health and family and Vaxfun."
