Seasonal Influenza and Influenza-like Illness Surveillance

Media Talking Points

Activity Level: Regional Activity

• Definition: Increased ILI in ≥ 2 but less than half of the regions AND recent (within the past 3 weeks) lab confirmed influenza in the affected regions, OR institutional outbreaks (ILI or lab confirmed) in ≥ 2 but less than half of the regions AND recent (within the past 3 weeks) lab confirmed influenza in the affected regions.

Summary: Public health surveillance data sources indicate a confirmed influenza cluster in the west central region and a continued increase in over-the-counter sales across the state. The percentage of emergency department visits with patients exhibiting constitutional symptoms has increased for the fourth consecutive week.

Surveillance Data:

- Influenza-like Illness (ILI) Sentinel Providers reported 0.75% of patients had ILI signs and symptoms. Influenza-like Illness is defined as a fever (≥ 100° F), **and** cough <u>and/or</u> sore throat. Temperature can be measured in the physician's office or at home.
- Over-the-counter (OTC) sales experienced a statistically significant deviation from the expected in seven regions.
- Emergency department visits experienced a statistically significant deviation from the expected in seven regions.
- ODH lab has not reported any positive confirmed isolates (through 9/14/09).
- ODH lab has not reported any results for those cases that are PCR positive for seasonal influenza (through 9/14/09).
- Results obtained from pandemic influenza A H1N1 testing conducted at the ODH laboratory are now included in the chart below (total through 9/14/09).
- Incidence of confirmed influenza-associated hospitalizations in 2009-2010 season = 26 (total through 9/12/09).
- No pediatric influenza-associated mortality reports have been made (through 9/14/09).
- Confirmed Pandemic Influenza A H1N1-related hospitalizations: 71 (year-to-date total through 9/12/09).
- Confirmed Pandemic Influenza A H1N1-related deaths: 3 (year-to-date total through 9/12/09).

Analysis Considerations:

• Influenza-associated hospitalization became a reportable condition on 1/1/09. Therefore, only cases that were entered after 1/1/09 will be considered for analysis purposes.
