Stark County's Influenza Weekly Report

Week 41 (10/8/17-10/14/17)

During Week 41:


- During week 41 Stark County had zero influenza-associated hospitalizations.
- The national cumulative rate for laboratory-confirmed influenza-associated hospitalizations per 100,000 is not available yet this season.
- During week 41, 82 influenza A specimens were collected nationally from public health laboratories, 3 subtyped as the 2009 H1N1 virus and 67 subtyped as the H3 virus.
- Nationally, no influenza-associated pediatric deaths have been reported.

Viruses Circulating vs. Viruses in this Year's Vaccine:

- Nationally, 160 of the influenza A (H3N2) viruses collected prior to October 14, 2017 were antigenetically characterized. Of those characterized 98% were components in this year's influenza vaccine.
- There were 43 influenza A (H1N1) viruses collected and 100% matched the influenza A (H1N1) component in this year's vaccine.
- There were 68 specimens characterized nationally as Influenza B. Of these, 40 subtyped from the Yamagata Lineage and 28 subtyped from the Victorian Lineage. Of these specimens 85% matched the Influenza B component of the 2016-2017 vaccine.

Graph 1: Influenza Cases Reported to the Local Health Department.


• There was one case of hospitalized or non-hospitalized influenza to report for Week 41 in Stark County.


Graph 2: Sentinel Provider Reported Influenza Like Illness (ILI) in Stark County.


Graph 3: Emergency Department Visits for Respiratory and Constitutional Syndromes.


