What is the OraQuick Rapid HIV-1/HIV-2 Antibody Test How is it performed?

Currently at the Canton City Health Department we perform an OraQuick Advance Rapid HIV-1/HIV-2 Antibody Test – a screening test for HIV antibodies - for the virus that causes AIDS. It is a test that detects antibodies to HIV-1/HIV-2 with a finger stick sample of blood. As with all HIV screening tests, a reactive test result needs to be confirmed by an additional more specific test.

To perform the test the fingertip is cleaned with alcohol and pricked with a lancet to get a small drop of blood. The blood is collected with a specimen loop and transferred to a vial where it is mixed with a developing solution. Results of the test can be read in as little as 20 minutes. The whole process can take anywhere between 20 and 40 minutes.
